Grassroots Program Makes Rooftop Solar Power Cheaper and Easier Than Ever

Last year climate and energy nonprofit NC WARN brought to Chatham County a highly successful program to expand solar power on homes and businesses.

Solarize Chatham installed 330 kilowatts of solar on 64 rooftops, becoming the most successful **Solarize** program in North Carolina to date.

The County Board of Commissioners unanimously passed a resolution praising the program and encouraging other Chatham homes and businesses to adopt solar power.

Between now and May 15th, Solarize Chatham returns! The program helps customers generate most of their own electricity. Power bill savings start the day the system is installed, locking in low-cost clean energy for 25 years or more.

Solarize Chatham uses high-quality equipment installed by two of North Carolina's leading solar companies, Yes! Solar Solutions of Cary and Southern Energy Management of Morrisville.

Solarize programs help build the entire local solar industry, creating good jobs, reducing utility bills and replacing climate-damaging fossil fuels. They help all customers by undercutting Duke Energy's case for continually raising rates to build giant power plants.

NC WARN is also offering **Solarize** in Durham and Western Wake Counties this spring.

The **Solarize** model is endorsed by the US Department of Energy and the NC Clean Energy Technology Center.

The **Solarize** model was developed in Portland, Oregon and has proven highly successful in dozens of US communities since 2009.

How it Works

The first step is a free home assessment to determine if your house is suitable for solar. If it is, you will receive a proposal tailored to your needs.

Through bulk purchasing and neighbor-to-neighbor outreach, Solarize cuts pricing by up to 24% from solar prices that have already fallen 80% in recent years. Since organizations like NC WARN and their volunteers are doing the marketing, the installers can afford to discount their regular pricing, and the Solarize price keeps dropping as more people make the decision to go solar.

The Solarize program makes solar easier by pre-selecting the installers and by offering a website and free public information sessions to educate the community about solar tax credits, utility incentives, and financing options. All this makes solar accessible and affordable for a wider range of homeowners than ever before.



Since NC WARN strongly believes that solar energy is for everyone, we are also working on models that would put rooftop solar within reach of low- and fixed-income homeowners and renters.

Pricing Example

Everyone's situation is different, but here's a pricing example for a moderate-sized system:

if your system is	the average market price would be	Solarize price	approximate net cost after Federal & NC tax credits, if you can take full advantage of them
4 kilowatts	\$19,000	\$15,800	\$6,320

Your final price could be as much as 8% lower if enough people participate!
