Dear President Brodhead,

Thank you for suspending the Duke Energy project in favor of an open stakeholder review process. We continue researching the proposed Duke Energy plant and alternatives, and remain confident that a careful and open campus – community review will lead to a far better path forward for the University.

Obviously, by very definition, a stakeholder process includes all interested parties. Therefore, NC WARN looks forward to participating along with other organizations and individuals who have demonstrated an interest in the project. As you know, we have considerable energy experience and resources, familiarity with Duke Energy, and a community-oriented perspective that would be valuable to a constructive stakeholder process.
